Rest for Your Souls

So, plainly, I am weary. I suspect you may be as well. I am weary of the turmoil of the elections. There are not many opportunities to escape from it. It invades every space we occupy lately. To begin with, we do not have many spaces left in our refuge. They have become closed in this time of Pandemic. We are hesitant to venture out into public for fear of becoming a statistic. So, we are left to the electronic distractions which offer an escape from time to time. Now, however, even those escape mechanisms are clogged with demands for our votes and money. I have done enough binging on Netflix and Amazon to last a lifetime. I am now repeating the repeats!

Escape is necessary. So, I look for a new way to alter circumstances away from stress and into rest for my weary soul (and brain). Words come to me from Matthew 11. They are famous words offered by the Gospel writer, put into the mouth of Jesus. "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." Ah, just what I needed! It clearly is an invitation to step away from the cares that burden and into a place of rest.

The context is important. The movement begun by John the Baptizer was in full swing, until John criticized Herod for committing adultery. Herod slapped him in prison until he could decide how to handle this popular evangelist. So, all of the people who had flocked to John to repent and be baptized for the forgiveness of sin were left without benefit of what had been offered. The people were becoming restless, pressured, as if their salvation was being held back by a dam.

Jesus is ministering in the country sides, small hamlets at a time, but word was spreading of his ministry. The people became curious as to whether Jesus might be the replacement for John and could offer them repentance and forgiveness. Even John wondered if the true Messiah had come. It was a tense time, filled with turmoil and questions. Sound familiar?

Jesus offers his now famous invitation for the people to come to him, that he offers rest from the stress of wondering what the future holds and how they can return to God and live. Jesus offered a bit of peace in a troubled world. Not only that, Jesus offered a Way. The invitation included not only rest from the torture of sin, but a path that led to gentleness, humility, and rest. Ah, how pleasant that sounds!

I really feel that, at times such as these, we can reach back into the essential teachings Jesus offered, a path which leads to a less panicked way of life. It does come at a cost though, the yoke. We need to find the answer as to whether we are willing to yoke ourselves with Jesus to find that path. It may, at times, be troublesome when we want to veer off the path for a bite of sweeter grasses, a shiny object or two, a distraction from learning. The yoke not only offers strength, it gives purpose. Remember that path which leads to rest?

When I am feeling particularly stressed by CNN or Fox, I take a break and slip back into that yoke of learning and striving for a better place to. Read the words again, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and *I will give you rest*. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and *you will find rest for your souls*." Can you not feel the knots relaxing in your shoulders? Can you not feel your breath again? Can you not feel the frenzied thoughts slip away? Jesus beacons, Come, Rest in your soul. Refreshed by that release of chaos, we come to our future, resolved to continue the path of Peace and Justice.

Do me a favor. Take a deep breath, let it out. Do it again. Repeat as often as you wish. With each breath feel that yoke. Learn. Rest in your soul. Blessings.

Have you attended the 'In Person' worship, Sunday mornings? At the October Leadership Team meetings, the LT voted to increase the seating capacity to 50 for worship, without prior reservations necessary. The other procedures for attending, are still in place. We want to see everyone in worship, even though you are masked.

Other news from the LT virtual meeting. A Nominating Committee was announced, composed of Joanne Arvid, Judy Minier, and Bill Colson. They will produce a slate of candidates for election to the Leadership Team of 2021. The election will be during the Annual Meeting, to be held January 24th, 2021. The slate of candidates will be presented to the Leadership Team at the January meeting, to be held January 12th.

September expenses exceeded our donations by \$2,946, but we still have a YTD surplus of \$11,347 to get us through to the end of the year. We are ahead of last year's September YTD net of donations over expenses by \$12,940.

For the first time this year, our YTD contributions (\$130,201) were below budget of (\$130,950), albeit slightly (\$749). A large portion of that variance (\$415) is because many of the groups that regularly use Faith Hall for meetings have been on hiatus because of the pandemic. One group has returned but others are still not meeting. We will continue to see a drop in "rent" over the coming months. Although 2020 YTD expenses are well below budget, we will see an uptick in expenses in December with the paid time off payments to employees. Additionally, Comcast expenses are going up. Initially the increase was going to be \$90 per month, but I am still negotiating with them to lower the pricing. Keep your fingers crossed.

If you would like an easy and cost-free way to contribute to the church, you can set up an automatic payment through your bank by using electronic banking. Payments are mailed from your bank to the church. If you would like to pursue this form of payment, please be advised that the address that should be used for mailing the check is Congregational United Church of Christ, Punta Gorda, PO Box 510838, Punta Gorda, FL 33951-0838. Most banks do not charge for this service—not even for the postage to mail the payment.

What is a saint? The Apostle Paul often speaks of hagioi—a word that means “holy ones,” but is usually translated “saints” in our English-language Bibles. Paul writes “To all God’s beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints” (Romans 1:7).

Bishop William How wrote the hymn, “For All the Saints,” in 1864 for All Saints Day, a day meant to honor departed saints, whether known or unknown. This hymn, then, celebrates the saints who

went before us—” who from their labors rest.” It tells how God sustained them through difficult times—strengthened them to battle evil—brought them light in their darkest days. This hymn has always meant something personal to me. So many of our loved ones who have gone before us are in that “cloud of witnesses”.

As saints, we are linked to each other by our faith in Christ. The New Testament speaks of Christians as brothers and sisters, so we are one family in Christ. We are blood relatives of Godly people from other races and nations (the blood that connects us is the blood of Christ). We are blood relatives of Godly people who lived long ago—and of those who will come after us.

It offers a prayer for the saints of today—for us and for our children. It says, “O may Thy soldiers, faithful, true, and bold, Fight as the saints who nobly fought of old.”

It paints a picture of the saints of all times streaming through the Pearly Gates in countless numbers. “And when the strife is fierce, the warfare long, steals on the ear the distant triumphs song, then hearts are brave again, and faith grows strong. Alleluia! Alleluia!
